- 9. Scholarships for Military Children, deadline Feb. 13. Applications must be hand-delivered or sent by U.S. Postal Service or other delivery method to a commissary by close of business. The program awards at least one \$2,000 scholarship at each commissary with qualified applicants dependent, unmarried children of an active-duty, reserve or Guard member, retiree or survivor of a military member who died on active duty, or survivor of a retiree.
