The World War II navigator fought for his country in the

European and Pacific theaters and returned home after the war to become a successful businessman running a grocery store in his hometown of Butte, Montana..

During the war the United States Army Air Forces officer was assigned to the 654th Bombardment Squadron of the 25th Bombardment Group (Reconnaissance), and served as a navigator on the Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress and the De Havilland DH-98 Mosquito.

# History of the Montana Air National Guard (Scanned negative from the photograph archives)



The big news of the 120th Fighter Group in 1966 was the aircraft conversion from the F-89 Scorpion to the F-102 Delta Dagger. The first F-102 was flown into Great Falls on July 30th, 1966 by Maj. Jim Aiken, a former member of the 120th.

On August 1, an active-duty Air Force team arrived at the 120th to assist with the conversion. They remained for six months.

The first TF-102 two-seat trainer arrived in Great Falls on September 28. All affected sections were well into their conversion training when the TF-102 arrived.
